



Alexander Chernyy—one of the iconographers working with Dmitry Shkolnik—has just finished completing the canvases for "The Last Judgment." This is the last stage in our parish iconography project. The scene above, composed of multiple canvases, will be installed on the west wall in the balcony. There is no installation date yet. Since the invasion of Ukraine, Alexander and his family fled Russia and are now living and working in Tblisi, Georgia, so Dmitry will travel there to bring the canvases to the U.S., then schedule to visit Kearney for the installation.
